Gr 4-6 • This anthology, published in partnership with We Need Diverse Books, presents 10 short stories from a stellar list of authors: Kwame Alexander, Matt de la Peña, Jacqueline Woodson, Soman Chainani, Grace Lin, Walter Dean Myers, Tim Federle, Meg Medina, Tim Tingle, and Kelly Baptist. De la Peña's linguistically grooving basketball story will have readers swaying in their seats. Verbal roadblocks are hurled at the protagonist from the street-smart players inside the gym: he's too young, too skinny, too Mexican. His resolve yields multiple life lessons on and off the court. Woodson's haunting "Main Street" follows Celeste, the only girl of color in an all-white New Hampshire town, and her friendship with lifetime resident Treetop. Both are suffering from different losses: Treetop's mother has recently passed away, and Celeste isn't accepted in her new home. Their warm connection soothes their mutual pain and promises to last even after Celeste and her mother decide to return to familiar and welcoming New York. This book is a treasure chest bursting with gems. From funny to heartrending, they pack a wallop of feelings, the most palpable being hope.

I've been working with my middle schooler on getting through this book. When he told me that most (all?) of his friends found it boring and difficult I was skeptical given the high rating. That was until we sat together and started reading it together. If you like stories that don't go anywhere. Stories

that, while thankfully short, still seem to drag on forever. Stories that are written more to support a narrative of inclusion and social mission than the actual enjoyment -- well, then I guess this would be a good book. Let's take one of the better short stories: *Sol Painting, Inc.*, about a young girl, Merci, who wants to take over her father's painting business, and doesn't much love school. She's smart, resourceful and interesting. Her father "surprises" her and her brother that they will be painting the private school for free in exchange for her tuition. Fast forward and some girls at the school accidentally mess up the paint on a door, don't apologize and Merci is mad that her father didn't yell at them. Until her brother explains that if dad had yelled, she might have lost her scholarship. And... that's it. This is the "hard lesson" in life she has to learn. It doesn't get much better. I think this is the sort of book that some adults feel that kids should read -- whether they enjoy it or not.

I absolutely adored this anthology. Each of these stories features a marginalized kid and the stories address and incorporate their identity without being exclusively an "issue" story. They were all enjoyable reads with thought-provoking themes. My personal favorites were *The Difficult Path* by Grace Lin, in which a poor servant girl who loves to read finds an unexpected way to use her skill; *Secret Samantha* by Tim Federle, which involves a queer/gender-nonconforming kid developing a crush on the new girl in their class and drawing her name for Secret Santa; and *Flying Lessons* by Soman Chainani, in which a shy Indian American boy goes on vacation to Europe with his grandmother and finds unexpected friends.

This was a fantastic short story collection for middle grade readers! Stories were unique & diverse and offered a wide range of characters & subject matter! I really hope that this collection is not the first of its kind! A few stories seemed to drag and throw off my pace - hence the 4 stars instead of 5! Can't wait to book talk this title with my fifth graders!
