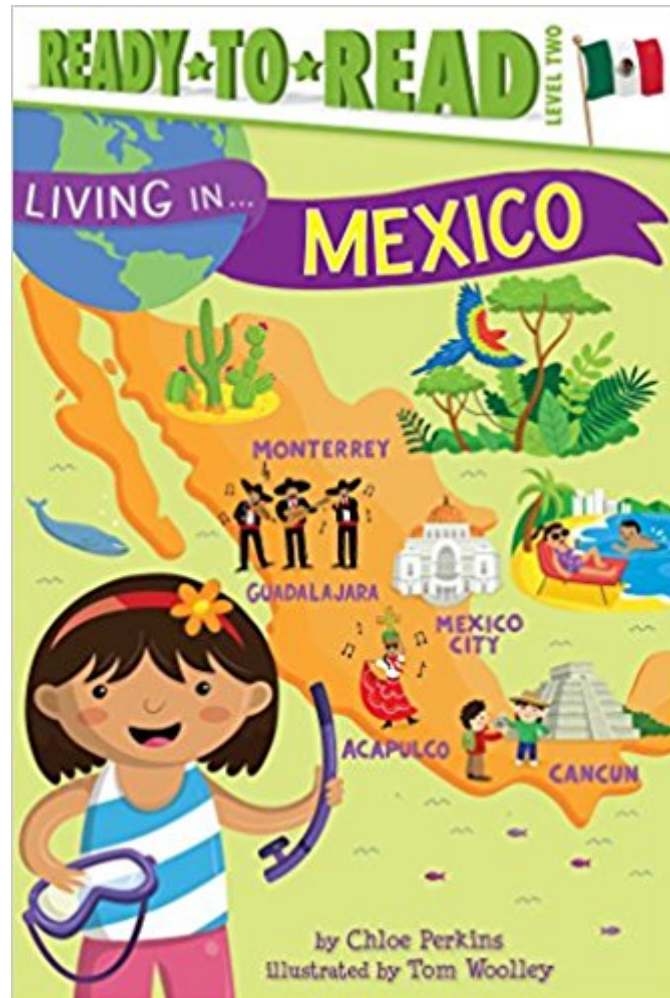

We are mexicans and just looking at the preview pictures it gives such wrong info that it made me doubt all the others. Mexico City was not built on top of an ancient city Guadalajara, it was built on top of Tenochtitlan. Guadalajara is the actual capital of the State of Jalisco. Watch out!

Not what I expected at all. This is a book for little kids. Is it necessary to mention the "Day of the Dead" celebrations? There are many locations not mentioned. Also, brushing teeth and combing one's hair is not limited to Mexico. Disappointed.

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
