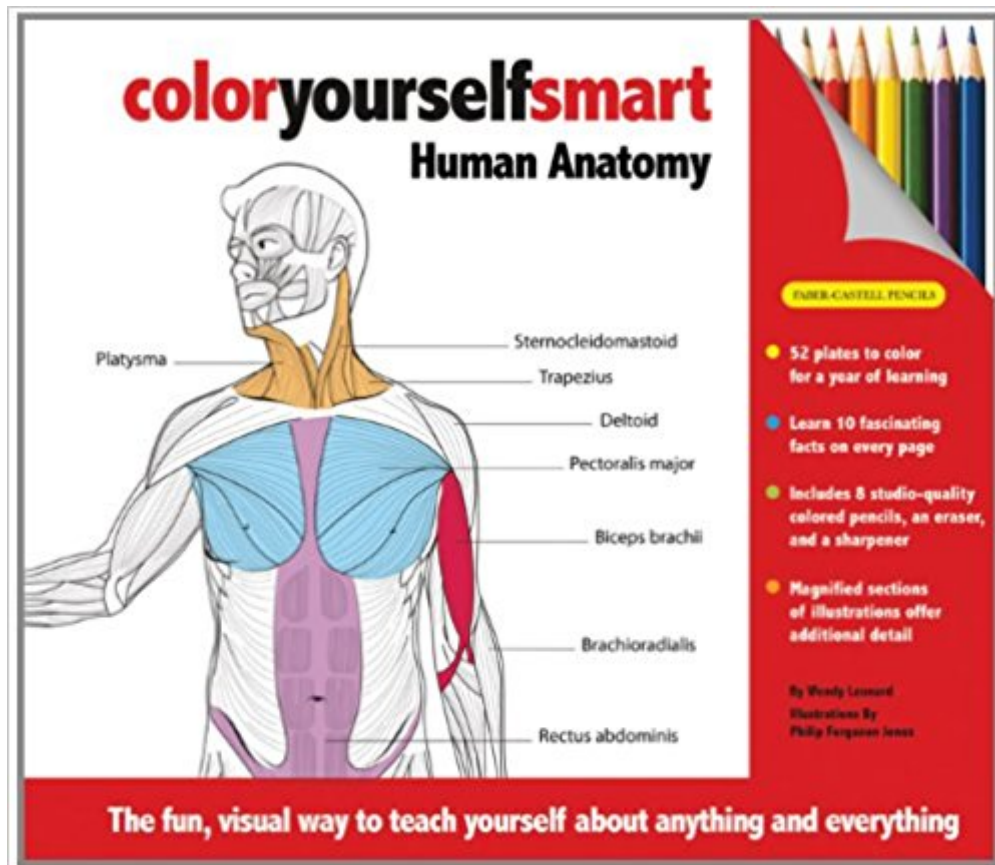

This sounded like such a good idea -- to color pictures of human organs and systems, learning to recognize how they all are related and fit together. Too good to be true? You bet! The pictures were quite detailed (good) but the models were in the back of the book (dreadful). It would be impossible to work from one to the other. Moreover, the models did not seem to exactly represent the uncolored pictures. All three 'Color Yourself Smart' books were deeply disappointing. Many years ago, I met Wynn Kapit when he was developing his first Anatomy Coloring Book -- now in its third edition (The Anatomy Coloring Book). Later, I used it in classes for becoming a Certified Massage Therapist. It is a MUCH better choice if you want to actually learn anything. I just wish the listings allowed one to peek inside.

This book is fabulous! The writing is clear - descriptive and detailed, and yet easy to understand. It sounds as if the author is a friend enthusiastically talking to you about anatomy and cool little-known facts that make it really interesting (the pancreas also makes baking soda!) and easy to remember. The illustrations are precise, well-labeled, and tie in perfectly with the text. And the quality of the book itself is impressive - from the sturdy cover & binding, to the paper, to the art pencils that are

included. This book really is perfect for anyone needing or wanting to learn the details of anatomy - as stated in the book intro, from "precocious teens, college students, curious adults, and fellow nerds everywhere". I was a bit skeptical of a "coloring book" having detailed, useful information, but this one has it in spades. And coloring is a bonus! Well worth the price. I'm giving a copy to all of my nephews in college this year.

The pages were intact, however, the container holding the colored pencils was open and a few of the pencils were missing. I will keep the product because it is usable, but I thought I was buying a completely new unopened item.

I purchased this for myself a few months ago, to complement several other "standard" anatomy books I already had (Netter's, etc). What I didn't anticipate was how incredibly accessible the book would be. As a tutor who works with high school students on a regular basis, I am able to use this book to increase their understanding of complexities. When my client had difficulty just last week, I was able to turn to the book and the concise, easy-to-understand explanation cleared up her questions. Stellar resource for students and educators alike!
