

Reading this book today was so fitting. We had a beautiful day but of course it was windy so my two toddlers and I decided to go inside because it was a bit harder to do the typical things that we do outside. This book is a very simple book but it does give a few ideas of things we could do to actually enjoy the wind. There were enough ideas for my toddlers to actually get excited about. Instead of spending the rest of the day inside, which is what we would have normally done we got inspired to pick a couple of the activities and go back out. It is so important to get outside and get moving especially for young kids! This is a creative way to inspire my kiddos and me. My son has been memorizing books and this will also be a fun one to master in no time. It is simple and the

If you are in need of a couple of quick ideas of things to do on a windy day, this is a basic start. There are a few things I would not have immediately thought about and a few obvious ones thrown in too. My 6 year old wanted to run outside and try them all as soon as they were uttered. She had no problems reading this short and to the point book to me. Expect brief one sentence pages with colorful pictures to accompany the proposal. It would have been nice to see a few extra details along with each suggestion. For example, when "fly a kite" is shown, having an easy to follow tutorial on how to make your own kite would be helpful. A DIY page would really make this book go from simple to cool windy day games. This ebook is clearly meant for very young children to explore themselves. It was completely read to me in under a minute. I went back over it with my child to discuss why these suggestions would be good for a windy day versus any other day and asked her how she'd make the items mentioned by the book, like a parachute or boat. She went right to engineering her own toy (read: cat) parachute system. I received this book without compensation, but with a discount using my iPhone to read the ebook. Like other "Baby Professor" books, I think it's great for very young kids (PreK-2nd Grade). This book has bright, colorful, and engaging photos and simple words that are perfect for beginner readers. It also has great ideas of what kinds of games to play outside when it's windy. I, especially, love windy days, and I'm happy to see a book that encourages getting outdoors and enjoying the weather! This is

not a detailed book with new or unique ideas for parents. This is a book for kids, to read and navigate on their own. The pictures help a lot, especially if you are a pre-reader but also to keep the attention of new readers. It's a quick and easy book, with simple words, that won't discourage new readers. It's 15 pages long! I think this is a good book to add to your collection, and the next time there's a windy day, read it first, then have your child pick one, or all, of the activities to do and head to your local park or backyard to do them. Just note, that you should read this book first, as you'll need to get some stuff beforehand (ie. a kite, balloons). I'd also say if you have an early reader, order it and all the other Baby Professor books to practice reading. This product was provided free in exchange for my unbiased honest review.

While I am usually a fan of Baby Professor's books, I found this one to be a bit lacking. Don't get me wrong, there are many good points in it-- for one, it does have some good ideas for games that children can play on windy days, and as always, the pages are each accompanied by a lovely, high-definition photograph of either children playing the aforementioned game or the things that they can play with. This is a point where Baby Professor's publications always shine, and though I personally got the book on my iPad, I imagine that they would look just as nice published in the printed form. However, while the ideas are created, they are more touched upon than anything. One of the ideas, for example, is to make a set of wind chimes. I agree with the writer, making wind chimes and watching them flutter about in the wind during the day is a GREAT idea, but that's literally all that is said: make a set of wind chimes. There are no instructions on how to do so, no list of materials or anything else, leaving children and their parents at a bit of a loss as to how to do the activity. For a book that is supposed to give ideas to children, instructions on how to do them would be more helpful than a short sentence describing what they are.
