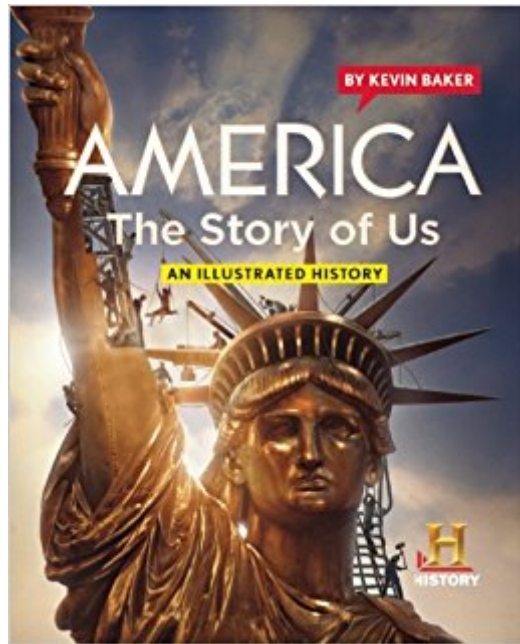

Ever since its first settlers came for freedom and wealth, America has always boasted a rambunctious, idiosyncratic population. In this poppy illustrated history, historian Baker even-handedly reveals how we gained independence, acquired vast territory, and made monumental industrial and technological advances while overcoming tragedies of war, civil and labor unrest, economic depression, and other grand challenges. Baker doesn't shy away from the darker corners of American history, and the origins and expansion of the slave trade, brutality towards Native Americans, and exploitation of land for profit are all covered here. As produced by the A&E network, this is a glossy, highly-accessible survey of the great American experiment from 1497 to today, full of eye-catching photography, charts, maps, highlighted text, and historical documents (there's not a single page free of some graphic element). Unfortunately, yet again fails to let their product have the content first. I love my Kindle Fire, but the video only works on apple products. Come on , get it together.

Perhaps I was expecting too much, and maybe this formula isn't conducive to the more in depth coverage I was hoping for. It left off almost the entirety of the period between the initial Plymouth colonization and the revolutionary war. No mention at all of the French and Indian Wars that we were very much a part of. I haven't gone through it far enough to give an accurate assessment of the whole, but so far it seems to me to be the type of glossed over history so prevalent in school curriculums today. School kids get this "Shining City on the Hill" perspective without ever learning about the darker sides of our culture. If you aren't taught those things at a younger age, you will never learn to recognize them and correct them in the future. It is done in a nice format though. Just wish it were a little grittier.
