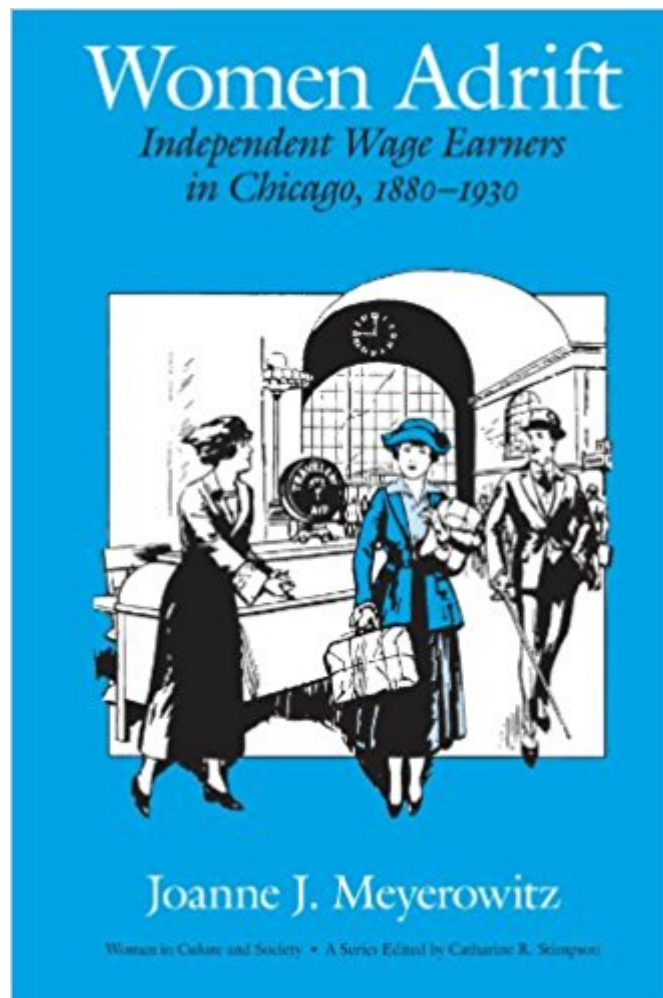




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Women Adrift: Independent Wage Earners In Chicago, 1880-1930 (Women In Culture And Society)
