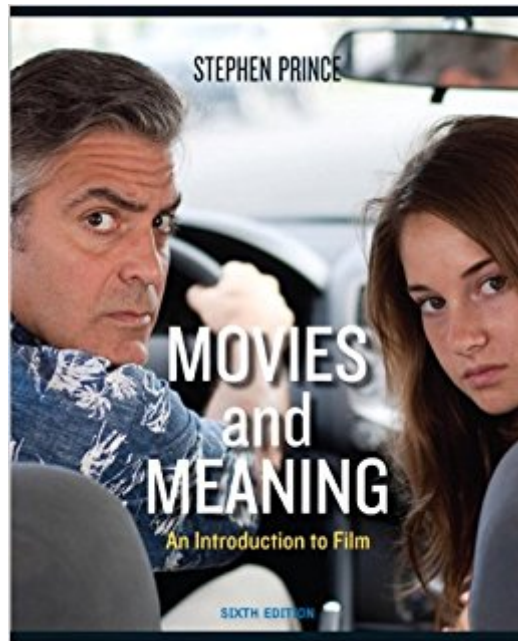




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Movies And Meaning: An Introduction To Film, 6th Edition

The topics covered are: the structure of film, cinematography, production design, acting, editing, principles of sound design, narrative film, visual effects, modes of screen reality, business and art, film theory and criticism. I love how the book breaks down and explains each aspect of film. It is not a how to book; it is geared towards giving reader/students a better understanding of the filming process.
