

I play chess with my son often and he is able to put up a good game. After researching this book, I'd hoped that its point of view and presentation would make the study of chess openings, gambits, and end-games fun and more approachable for a young adolescent. In the end, the book isn't able to avoid the dry display of move sequences found in every other chess book I've read. It is more of a fun wrapper stretched over a standard treatment of chess instruction rather than a novel approach to teaching young chess students. Not bad, but I'd hoped for something a little different.
