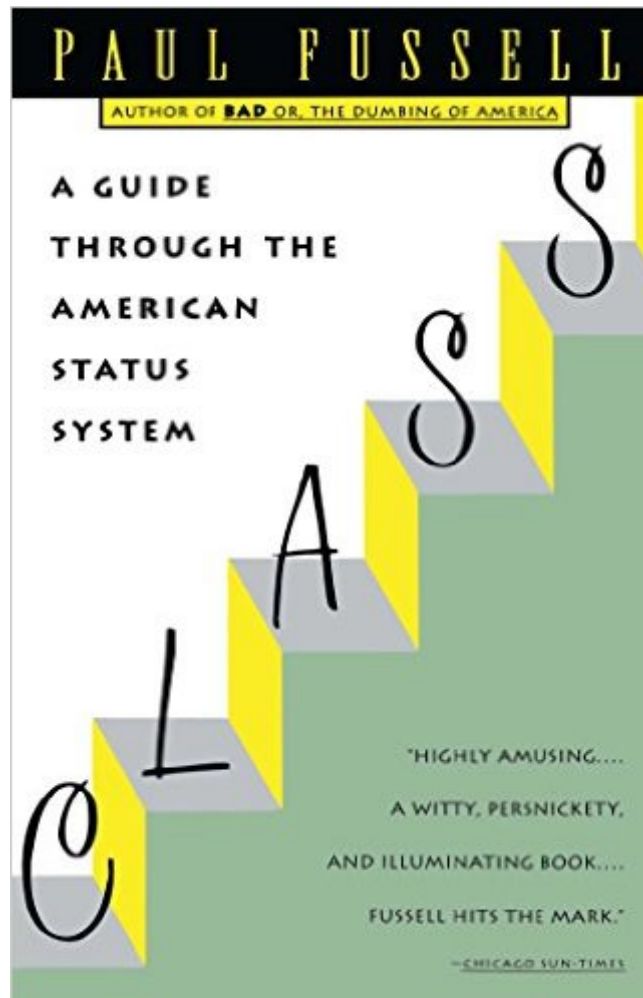

Paul Fussell, critic, essayist, and cultural commentator, has recently won the H. L. Mencken Award of the Free Press Association. Among his books are *The Great War and Modern Memory*, which in 1976 won both the National Book Critics Circle Award and the National Book Award; *Abroad: British Literary Traveling Between the Wars*; *Wartime: Understanding and Behavior in the Second World*

War; and, most recently, BAD or, The Dumbing of America. His essays have been collected in The Boy Scout Handbook and Other Observations and Thank God for the Atom Bomb and Other Essays. He lives in Philadelphia, where he teaches English at the University of Pennsylvania.

Overvaluation and undervaluation are the primary characteristics of class distinction. Throughout Fussell's book these distinctions cover every inch of visible eccentricity. From the knot to the tie and from the facade of the facade, we learn the extent to which the image supersedes the man. Frankly, I found the book a bit silly. Fussell merely catalogues the ways in which status seekers seek their status. His approach seems manic in its' portrayal of the obvious. Nevertheless, the book is written in good humor. It is an easy and somewhat fun book to read... or merely skim through!

I have bought this book a handful of times over the years and given to people because it is hilarious. Even though it is from the 80's most of the points made still ring true.

An interesting book that addresses, in a semi-formal manner, the social and economic traits that are associated with groups or 'classes' of people. The descriptions are not applied in a highly specific manner but are used to explore how social 'standing' of different groups vary and how people in different 'classes', as defined by the author, move between these classes. While the book is not a scholarly treatise it does offer interesting insights with respect to how different social 'classes' are perceived and how they interact with one another.

I know this book was written tongue in cheek, yet, it provides a vocabulary to describe observable America (and Americans around us). I find myself ordering multiple copies of Class: A Guide Through the American Status System, always keeping one to replace the one I've loaned out, and then giving more as gifts. Important safety tip: Some friends/acquaintances may be uncomfortable with the contents. It's funny, as this outs them as the poseurs they probably are.

This was a quick and amusing read. The book was written many years ago, but the portraits it paints of the various classes still hold up.
